COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Today's academic regalia—the robes, hoods, and tams—originated in medieval Europe. In 1895, representatives of America's leading academic institutions adopted a code of academic dress. The code regulates the cut, style, and materials of the gowns, and prescribes colors to represent different fields of learning. Today, with few exceptions, the academic robes are black and the colors of the hood reflect the field of learning and academic institution. At WMed for the medical degree, the gown is faced with black velvet; three bars of velvet are used across the sleeves. The hood is hunter green with a chevron of brown and gold. For master of science degrees, the gown has long swooping sleeves, and the hood is science gold with a chevron of brown and gold. All graduates wear a brown tassel with a WMed Medallion.

WMED SEAL AND MEDALLION

The institutional seal, a symbol of Western Michigan University Homer Stryker M.D. School of Medicine, is one of an academic institution's most important symbols. Serving as the legal mark of the institution, the seal is used to authenticate official documents such as diplomas. The WMed seal includes the institutional name and two elements of the logo—the W and the Rod of Asclepius. The medallion is three inches in diameter, crafted with antique brass, and reveals the institutional seal. The medallion is at the center of a brass necklace which is a permanent part of the dean's academic regalia, and is worn at formal ceremonial events.

THE MACE

The ceremonial mace is used to lead the academic procession at commencement and other special ceremonial occasions, signifying the importance of the event and the conformation of the academic process. The 42-inch mace is made of natural walnut and is topped with a 4-inch antique brass medallion of the institutional seal.

Class Oath

The oath of Hippocrates is a symbol of the medical profession and perhaps the most widely known of Greek medical texts. The Hippocratic Oath requires a new physician to swear upon the healing gods that he or she will uphold professional ethical standards. Over the centuries, it has been rewritten often to suit the values of different cultures that have been influenced by Greek medicine. A medical oath declares the ethos of medicine, and includes solemn promises that identify the covenant relationship between physicians, other healthcare providers, patients, and society as a whole. During the very first weeks of medical school, medical students in the Class of 2022 created their own class oath which enabled the students to reflect on the principles they feel are important to embrace as medical professionals. By writing their own words, the oath created the foundation for their medical education and medical career.

As a role model and leader of my community, I recognize and understand the breadth of my influence and responsibility. Thus, I will model humility, integrity, kindness, and compassion.

I will value diversity and inclusion and readily engage with different viewpoints, especially when they challenge my own.

I will practice self-reflection and address my own biases in order to remain an objective, open, and active listener.

I will ensure equal treatment regardless of culture, creed, or social status.

I will prioritize my patients' needs, advocate for their interests, and promote their overall prosperity.

I will value my patients' autonomy and empower them to make informed healthcare decisions.

I will promote a culture of trust by fostering a safe atmosphere for patients to freely express themselves.

I will remain deserving of my patients' respect and understand that they too have valuable lessons to offer.

Recognizing the challenges of this profession, I pledge to uphold these principles to the best of my ability and fulfill these responsibilities with perseverance, empathy, and diligence.

Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society: The Michigan Epsilon chapter at WMed recognizes students who have shown dedication to academia, peer teaching, leadership, humanism, and service. Students become eligible for this honor in their third year, and are selected by faculty who are members of the society. *Student members denoted with* +.

CLEAR Award: Students in the class selected one peer who exemplifies excellence in each area of the medical school's CLEAR mission: Clinician, Leader, Educator, Advocate, and Researcher.

Global and Public Health Distinction: Students honored with the Global and Public Health Distinction have completed additional training in improving health and achieving health equity with an emphasis on population-based prevention. This distinction recognizes the student's commitment to providing equitable and thoughtful care to individuals, communities, and populations with an understanding that public health is fundamental to medicine and to combating morbidity and mortality from altering perspectives.

Gold Humanism Honor Society: We believe in the importance of developing humanistic future physicians who are dedicated to compassionate, respectful, and empathetic patient care. Students who have exhibited these characteristics while in medical school are inducted in the Gold Humanism Honor Society. Students are nominated for this honor in their third year by their peers. *Student members denoted with* \diamond .

Health Professions Scholarship Program: Students who have been accepted in the Health Professions Scholarship Program enter either the US Army, Navy, or Air Force and serve as a commissioned medical officer after graduation. Each branch accepts only 400 applicants each year.

Interprofessional Focus in Community Health Distinction: Students honored with the Interprofessional Focus in Community Health Distinction have completed additional requirements and training regarding clinical practice readiness skills to work in rural and underserved urban settings. This distinction recognizes the student's commitment to the skills to the interprofessional lens for community health increasing knowledge, developing expertise, clarifying values, and contributing to communities in need.

Outstanding Student Award: Each academic department selected one or more outstanding students from the class to be awarded on behalf of the department faculty.

Well-Being in Medicine Distinction: Students honored with the Well-Being in Medicine Distinction have completed additional requirements and training regarding wellness strategies and whole-person care. This distinction recognizes the student's commitment to the principles of personal and professional wellness and to becoming leaders and advocates for creating systemic change to support provider and patient well-being within the field of medicine.
